Meeting Minutes

Council Member Joe Soeder made a motion to approve the April 10, 2023 regular meeting minutes, seconded by Council Member Whitehouse. Motion carried 6-0.

Council Member Warford made a motion to approve the April 24, 2023 special meeting minutes, seconded by Council Member Mitchell. Motion carried 6-0.

Financial Report April 2023

Council Member Warford made a motion to approve the April 2023 financial report. Council Member Joe Soeder seconded the motion. Motion carried 6-0.

Police Department - April 2023

Chief Kaiser presented the monthly police report and answered all questions. There was discussion concerning the recent breaking into cars in Heritage Creek and all over Louisville.

Chief Kaiser requested 6 more helmets and gloves for the police bikes so that all officers who would be patrolling on bicycle would have their own. Council Member Joe Soeder made a motion to approve funding from ARPA monies, seconded by Council Member Mitchell. Motion carried 6-0.

Chief Kaiser requested 3 more car computers to be funded out of ARPA monies. Council Member Mitchell made a motion to approve, seconded by Council Member Joe Soeder. Motion carried 6-0.

Unfinished Business

The city clerk presented the Fischer Homes update. There were 4 April closings in the Villages for a total of 17 closings to date. There are currently 34 available homesites, 8 under contract and 2 available market homes.

Mayor Williams informed the council and residents that the Department of Planning and Zoning had approved the pavilion and that the next step would be obtaining the permit. The color of the pavilion was discussed. Council Member Joe Soeder made a motion to approve a blue roof with gray wrapping, seconded by Council Member Mitchell. Motion carried 6-0.

Mayor Williams spoke about the current Waste Management contract amendment drafted by our city attorney proposing reducing yard waste pickup to every other week instead of every week. This would reduce sanitation tax by \$21 annually per household. Council Member Joe Soeder made a motion to approve the amendment, seconded by Council Member Angie Soeder. Motion carried 6-0.

New Business

State Representative Kevin Bratcher was in attendance to speak about the legislation passed in the most recent session.

Mayor Williams spoke about setting the 2023 property tax rate and suggested keeping the tax rate at .192/\$100 as it was for 2022.

Council Member Joe Soeder made a motion to have the first reading of the 2023 Property Tax ordinance, seconded by Council Member Whitehouse. Motion carried 6-0. The city clerk read the ordinance.

Council Member Lloyd made a motion to have the first reading of the 2023 Sanitation Tax ordinance, seconded by Council Member Whitehouse. Motion carried 6-0. Council Member Warford read the ordinance.

Resident Comments

Paul Bischoff stated that he has seen kids riding dirt bikes on the sidewalks on Remembrance. Pat Bischoff informed the city of hearing gun shots. Chief Kaiser told her to contact the police department if she heard them again and that they would check it out. Doug Green asked for clarification on conceal and carry laws, and Chief Kaiser spoke on the subject. Parking on the street in the Villages was discussed.

Council Comments

Council Member Angie Soeder inquired about the status of purchasing new police cars, and Mayor Williams stated that it would be discussed in the 2023-2024 budget.
